The Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project is a quality improvement activity under the Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility program of the Health Resources and Services Administration's Federal Office of Rural Health Policy. The goal of MBQIP is to improve the quality of care provided in Critical Access Hospitals. This project provides an opportunity for individual hospitals to look at their own data, measure their outcomes against other CAHs and work on initiatives to improve outcomes and provide the highest quality of care to each and every patient.
