Best Practices in CAHs

This offering will focus on how some Kansas Critical Access Hospitals (CAHs) have developed quality programs in their facilities as well as added value to the patient experience through the sharing of best practices along with lessons learned.

Best practices can be examples of processes or activities that yield success or at least meaningful results. Very often, best practices are seen as an innovation in comparison to what was done by others. Lessons learned highlight knowledge or understanding gained by experience. The experience may be positive, as in a successful test or mission, or negative, as in a mishap or failure. Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Program (MBQIP) is a quality improvement activity under the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy's (FORHP) Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility (Flex) grant program. The goal of MBQIP is to improve the quality of care provided in critical access hospitals (CAHs) by increasing voluntary quality data reporting by CAHs and then driving quality improvement activities based on the data.
