

What is NHSN?

CDC's National Healthcare Safety Network is the nation's most widely used healthcare-associated infection (HAI) tracking system. NHSN provides facilities, states, regions, and the nation with data needed to identify problem areas, measure progress of prevention efforts, and ultimately eliminate healthcare-associated infections.

While ensuring data security, integrity, and confidentiality, NHSN gives healthcare facilities the ability to see their data in real-time and share that information with clinicians and facility leadership, as well as with other facilities (e.g., a multihospital system) and partners such as health departments or quality improvement organizations).

NHSN provides medical facilities, states, regions, and the nation with data collection and reporting capabilities needed to:

- Identify infection prevention problems by facility, state, or specific quality improvement project
- Benchmark progress of infection prevention efforts
- Comply with state and federal public reporting mandates, and ultimately,
- Drive national progress toward elimination of HAIs.

NHSN Data

- HAI data is a fundamental component of your organizational patient safety program
- Used to identify emerging and changing trends
- Essential to the planning, implementation, and evaluation of practice
- Identifies opportunity for improvement
- Builds capacity by building your business case

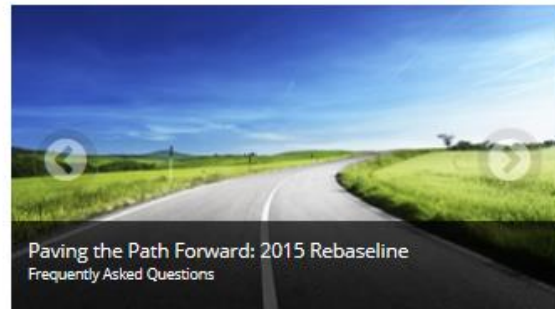


National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN)

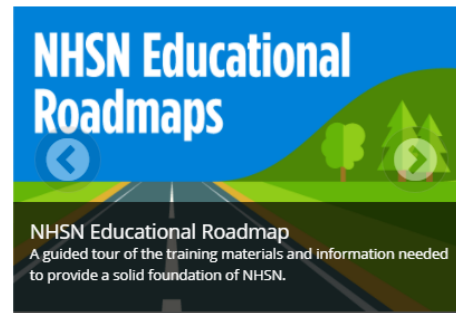
